first published in 1958 free associations is the story of the early life of ernest jones it was prepared for publication by his son mervyn who contributed an epilogue covering the period from 1918 when this book ends through jones s death in 1944 this new edition includes a reflective introduction by mervyn jones in which he writes about ernest jones as i could not write in 1958 one of the pioneers in psychoanalysis ernest jones was active in advancing the status as well as the development of the field in the wider forum of public opinion he made himself an advocate of the new science the huxley he liked to say to freud s darwin huxley had ranked below darwin in creative originality and had filled the role of the faithful and indispensably useful follower and mervyn jones believes both freud and jones were pleased by the comparison in addition to his important public and organizational roles as president of the british and international psychoanalytic associations jones made significant contributions to psychoanalytic theory when the nazis invaded vienna he saved much of the assets and archives of psychoanalysis at great personal risk and made the arrangements for freud to come to london in his introduction mervyn jones presents a sometimes surprising portrait of a thoroughly conventional man in what was then an unconventional profession he describes tensions and conflicts among the early freudians and situates freudianism with other theories that laid claim to scientific truth in the late nineteenth century free associations presents an evocative picture of wales and london at the turn of the century and describes the developing profession of psychoanalysis it is a dramatic story of success and failure and of a young man and how he responded to the new strange ideas of freud this book fills in our understanding of the history of psychoanalysis and its founders

much has been written about the lives of male physician psychoanalysts but little has been recorded about their wives and families who travel with them through their long medical training experience in memoir of a psychoanalyst s wife author jane linker schwartz offers a look at her life and how psychoanalysis helped shape her during the twentieth century as a nonagenarian and part time psychotherapist her long life reaches back to 1925 schwartz lived through the great depression the second world war and the aftermath of those turbulent years during the 1960s and 1970s she was a young white middle class american woman married to a psychiatrist psychoanalyst her collected memories throughout the years are mixed with a strong flavor of the history of american psychoanalysis while sharing schwartz personal story this memoir also chronicles the changes that took place in the twentieth century when the women s movement questioned the role of the traditional wife and mother as it was affected by professional ambitions outside the home it examines competition between married partners regarding professional status and whose work was more important it also traces changes in women s

behavior toward home responsibilities and children

student and protege of sigmund freud helene deutsch was one of the most influential psychoanalysts of her time an early woman analyst deutsch was an ardent feminist and a leading proponent of freud s controversial theories about the psychology of women deutsch was also one of the first prominent career women to combine a professional life with motherhood even though she never resolved her own conflicts over those contradictory demands at the time of her death in 1982 at the age of 97 helene deutsch was the last survivor of freud s original circle from vienna this volume is a definitive account of the life and works of this remarkable and enigmatic woman the author knew deutsch personally and was given exclusive access to her papers after her death the private life of helene deutsch was as unconventional as her professional life while felix deutsch a physician who specialized in psychosomatic medicine was to remain her husband for fifty years and father her son martin their relationship was highly eccentric roazen produces evidence that indicates felix deutsch may have been homosexual also that their son was raised primarily by felix as helene was more interested in her career than was felix in his and the deutesches often lived continents apart with the rise of nazism helene deutsch departed in 1935 for america she was welcomed in cambridge massachusetts by the boston psychoanalytic society and was made director of the society s new institute for the training of analysts her two volume the psychology of women published in 1945 remains one of the foundations of modern analysis roazen s biography is an authoritative portrait of a pioneer of psychoanalysis and one of the unique women of her day it will be of interest to psychoanalysts cultural historians and specialists in women s studies

heinz kohut 1913 1981 stood at the center of the twentieth century psychoanalytic movement after fleeing his native vienna when the nazis took power he arrived in chicago where he spent the rest of his life he became the most creative figure in the chicago institute for psychoanalysis and is now remembered as the founder of self psychology whose emphasis on empathy sought to make freudian psychoanalysis less neutral kohut's life invited complexity he obfuscated his identity as a jew negotiated a protean sexuality and could be surprisingly secretive about his health and other matters in this biography

charles strozier shows kohut as a paradigmatic figure in american intellectual life a charismatic man whose ideas embodied the hope and confusions of a country still in turmoil inherent in his life and formulated in his work were the core issues of modern america the years after world war ii were the halcyon days of american psychoanalysis which thrived as one analyst after another expanded upon freud s insights the gradual erosion of the discipline s humanism however began to trouble clinicians and patients alike heinz kohut took the lead in the creation of the first authentically home grown psychoanalytic movement it took an emigre be so distinctly american strozier brings to his telling of kohut s life all the tools of a skillful analyst intelligence erudition empathy contrary insight and a willingness to look far below the surface
